

Cookies Policy

A. Introduction

By using Our website, You are consenting to Our use of cookies and other tracking technology in accordance with this policy. If You do not agree to Our use of cookies and other tracking technology in this way, You should set your browser settings accordingly or should not use Our Sites. If You choose to disable the cookies that We use, this could impact Your user experience.

B. Definition

1. Cookies are small text files that are placed on Your computer or mobile device by websites that You visit. They are widely used in order to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the site.
2. See below for details on what information is collected by cookies and how We use that information.

C. Usage

1. We use cookies to gain a better understanding of how visitors use Our Sites. Cookies help us tailor to your personal needs, to improve usability.
2. To enable this, some cookies are applied when You enter the website. We keep all the information collected from cookies in a format that means We cannot identify individuals. Our cookies located on Your computer do not retain Your name or Your IP address.

D. Storage and Sharing

1. We do not collect or store your personal information (e.g. your name or address), unless you provide it to us. So this information cannot be used to identify who You are. The cookies simply enable Us to understand the behaviour on our Sites to help Us improve Your experience. We do not share this data with third parties, unless as outlined in this Privacy Policy or in Our Agreement with You.
2. If You share Our content online through social networks, You may be sent cookies from these websites. We do not control the setting of these cookies. So please check third party websites for more information about their cookies and how to manage them.

E. Types of Cookies

1. We use the following types of cookies on Our Sites:
 - a. **Necessary cookies:** These are cookies that are strictly necessary for the operation of our Site(s). Without these, the Site(s) will not work properly.
 - b. **Session cookies:** Session cookies are temporary cookie files which are erased when You close your browser. When You re-start Your browser and re-visit the Site(s), You shall be treated as a new visitor.
 - c. **Persistent cookies:** These are cookies which are set up to improve the functionality of the Site(s). E.g. If You edit or publish an article, an additional cookie will be saved in Your browser. This cookie includes no personal data and simply indicates the post ID of the article You just edited.
 - d. The above-mentioned cookies have varying expiry dates as determined by Us from time to time.

F. Changing Cookie Settings

1. Please ensure that Your computer setting reflects whether You are happy to accept cookies or not. You can set your browser to warn You before accepting cookies, or You can simply set it to refuse them, although You may not have access to all the features of the Site(s) if You do so. Your browser's help section will advise how You can do this.
2. If You use different computers in different locations, You will need to ensure that each browser is adjusted to suit Your cookie preferences.
